The decision was made last year to remove the resource teacher and replace with an AP. APs are able to do what resource teachers can do, plus more to support students and staff.

•	Questions: When/How do you start preparing grade 9s for transitions to High School? Nov is when we start to connect with other schools. Students go on tours of their designated school (parent suggested going on tour or to open house to learn lots about the school as well). Teachers help students with IPPs, look at alternate settings that could benefit students. Typically around May students can pick complementary courses. Teachers will suggest/select core courses that fit the student - IB, AP programs are options and discussed.
